Children can start learning about money at a young age. Parents can help very young kids understand how money is used by letting them hand money to a cashier. Soon children will be able to make choices about how to spend money as they learn that it is a limited resource. Older children can compare prices. 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Coping With High-Stakes Tests

Friends in Christ, the Passover event from the Old Testament times stands as one of the most important revelations of God bringing deliverance to His holy people, the Israelites. For 400 years they had been enslaved in Egypt. God brought plagues upon the Egyptians; each time Pharaoh said he would let God's people go, but then went back on his word. The final plague that brought deliverance was the plague of death. Every firstborn male in Egypt would die.

Well, not the firstborn males of Israel would die!! Because God instituted what is known as the Passover. The Israelites were to sacrifice a lamb, put the blood on the doorposts, and when the destroying angel passed through Egypt he would "pass over" the houses covered in the blood of the lamb.

There is a greater Passover that delivers not only from physical death, but from eternal death. The Blood of the Lamb, Jesus Christ, is the New Testament Passover. Christ Himself is the Passover, who came to deliver us from sin, Satan, and everlasting death.
