FROM THE PRINCIPAL

- The next round of MPCP Open Enrollment began **April 1st** and ends **April 20th**.
- WPCP is open until **April 20th**. No WPCP applications will be considered if they are not verified and submitted by 4:00pm on Friday, **April 20th**.
- For Tuition-paying families, the ½ price re-enrollment (registration) fee ends on Wednesday, **April 18th**. Now the cost is \$75 per students, after **April 18th** it is \$150 per student. So if you did not turn in your Contract for Enrollment and your re-enrollment fee, please do so as soon as possible to avoid the higher fee.
- Achievement Test Week is coming soon. All students in grades K - 8 will be taking achievement tests the week of **April 23rd**. Please check with your child's teacher if you have any questions.
- **Great News** - we have two new people joining our faculty next year. One will be our new 7th grade teacher, Ben Balsman, and one will be our new Early Childhood Administrator, Amy Puechner. Information will be coming home very soon for additional offerings in our Early Childhood program for next year.

FROM THE PASTOR

Life in this world can be difficult and very challenging at times. Life in this world can be filled with all kinds of trouble. Sometimes those difficulties and troubles can get us down, leaving us a bit depressed. Sometimes we can even *feel* a bit hopeless. That is exactly how Thomas must have felt.

Thomas was one of the twelve disciples who followed Jesus, learned from Him, trusted in Him. However, when Thomas saw Jesus handed over to sinners, be beaten, mocked, and then die on a cross, it left him both down and hopeless. Why? All he could see was the bad that had happened, but had forgotten God's plan was in the events. All he could see was the darkness of death, and he had forgotten the words of hope . . . that Christ would rise again.

We can be like Thomas. We can let our minds focus on the difficulties and challenges we face. We can focus on the affliction, or the trouble, or what is going wrong in life, so much so, that it is all we can see. It can rob us of hope. One of the greatest messages of Easter is that there is hope in Christ, always! There is hope for this fallen world to be recreated and restored to perfection. There is hope for sinners who continue to struggle with sin to be set free, now and for all eternity. There is a *singular Christian hope* that wells up to life everlasting. That hope is grounded and founded in Jesus Christ.

Paul writes in his letter to the Romans: **“Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through Him . . . we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts” (Romans 5:1-5a)**

Now that puts a different perspective on our difficulties and sufferings. God is working. God has a plan. God strengthens us to endure the difficulties, to strengthen our Christian character, and to fill us with hope. Keep your eyes on Jesus and His resurrection from the dead and you will have hope all your days. Filled with hope in Christ,
