

FROM THE PASTOR

Christmas music has been playing for weeks on the radio. Black Friday and Cyber Monday are past. Many folks have decorated their homes for Christmas, inside and out. There was a time when families waited until Christmas Eve to decorate. Gone are those days! Almost lost in the rush is the season of Advent. Like Lent before Easter, Advent is a time of preparation, in this case for the Nativity of our Lord, or Christmas. The word Advent means "to come". Readings about John the Baptist, the Second Coming of Christ, the visitation of Mary to Elizabeth, set the theme of eager expectation for Advent. The liturgical color of this season is blue, the color of hope.

One way to reintroduce Advent in our homes and classrooms is to set up an Advent Calendar. These can be home-made, purchased at a Christian book store or your favorite internet shopping site. They are usually made from card stock, very colorful, and feature a little window for each day of Advent, to be opened in sequence. Find a calendar that features a Scripture verse behind each window (many are rather secular in nature). Talk to your family or class about the purpose for this season, and may the Lord bless you as you prepare for the celebration of His birth!
