FALL FUNDRAISER

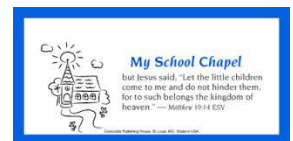

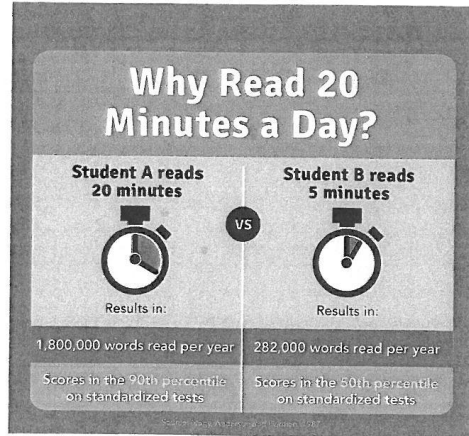
