FROM THE PASTOR

What a joy! Temperatures in the 70's and even near 80 degrees! There are buds on the trees, plants and flowers peaking through the ground in gardens all over the place, and my wife and I can take some wonderful walks in Greenfield Park again. We certainly need the exercise and it's a joy to go walking in these wonderful spring days.

There is even a greater joy than the earth returning to life from the dormancy of winter. This greater joy is knowing Jesus, know that after dying on the cross for our sins and the sins of all, He rose victorious over both sin and death. You see, death is the just punishment of sin.
