FROM THE PASTOR

Voices! They abound in our world. There are voices on social media, voices on the television, on talk shows, on songs on the radio and the like. So many voices! Which ones should you listen to??

This weekend is "Good Shepherd" weekend in the church year. Jesus is the Good Shepherd. In John's gospel, the 10th chapter, Jesus says, "My sheep hear *My voice*, I know them, and they follow me.
