

# FROM THE PASTOR

And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, <sup>25</sup> not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. Hebrews 10:24-25

#### This Holy Weekend

This is the most important week and weekend of the Church year. Yes Christmas may get more attention with all of its gifts and family get togethers, but if it was not for this weekend Christmas would not be a holiday. This is why we have more Church services than ever this weekend as we gather together and celebrate our Lord's death and resurrection. It is called Holy Week for it is this week that Christ fulfilled his purposes. Each day this weekend will have a different church service celebrating a different aspect of what Christ has done.

Tonight, Thursday night at 6:00, we have what we call Maundy Thursday. This is the day that we celebrate the Lord's Supper. It is the night in which our Lord and Savior was betrayed, and handed over to be crucified. By being crucified Christ earned many gifts to give to us, which he gives freely in the Lord's Supper. So come and join us at 6:00 as we have communion together, basking in the gifts of forgiveness, strength and protection that he gives.

Friday we have two services, one at 1:00 and the other at 6:00. This service, in my opinion, is one of the most underrated services that the Christian Church has. It is the Good Friday service, because we honor the fact that Christ died for us. During this service we sing several hymns focused on Jesus' death, and we focus on the final 7 words that Jesus said while he was on the cross. It is truly a sad day when we reflect on the fact that Jesus had to die, but when we remember he did it for us we rejoice and therefore call this day good.

Saturday is Easter Vigil and we have church at 5:00. It is the service of waiting. We are waiting for Easter, even as we are truly waiting for Jesus to return. We know that God will deliver us, but we are waiting for that deliverance by reminding ourselves of the times when God has delivered his people. We will go through stories of the Old Testament in order to reassure ourselves that we do indeed have a God of deliverance.

Finally we have Easter Sunday, the most important day of the year when we rejoice that Christ has risen! *He has risen indeed! Allelujah!* It is the most festive day of the year, where we rejoice that Jesus lives and that he has defeated Sin, Death and the power of the Devil. We have three services to honor this day- a Sunrise service at 6:30 and two other services at 9, and 11. In between these services come and join us in an Easter Breakfast (which also serves as a fundraiser for our Youth Group.) We will have eggs, pancakes, sausage and wonderful fellowship together as we celebrate everything Jesus has done for us.

So please come and join us during this 4 day weekend. Remember what Christ has done, how he has brought us all together through his death and resurrection!! Enjoy your time with friends and family this happy Easter!
