From the Principal

Our theme for the 2023-2024 school year is "CONNECTED".

CHILDREN CONNECT. They connect in play with building blocks, puzzles, and games. They connect socially with classmates, family, and friends. They connect through technology in the classroom and in many other contexts. Connections familiar to children and adults will be featured this year.

The most important connection for any child (of any age) is with Christ. The Good News of Christ connecting Himself to us in our Baptism and through His Word is the focus of our school year. Lutheran schools connect.

Lutheran schools connect children to a variety of curricular subjects and experiences. Lutheran schools connect with families, emphasizing that Lutheran education is always a partnership with the home. Lutheran schools connect with the congregation, emphasizing that the Lutheran school is an integral part of the mission and ministry of the congregation. Lutheran schools connect children to Lutheran worship through chapel services, where children will hear the Gospel. Lutheran schools connect with the communities in which they are located. Lutheran schools connect students and staff to the Great Commission.

In all things, Lutheran schools connect to Christ. This connection to Christ will be the emphasis of each chapel talk. But the connection to Christ goes well beyond the weekly chapel time. Teachers and staff will emphasize putting Christ into every aspect of the school day and school year. Our goal is that the connection to Christ goes with each child from chapel time and the classroom into the home and neighborhood.

FROM THE PASTOR

"I am the vine; you are the branches. Abide in Me and as I abide in you, you will bear much fruit." Jesus, the Gospel of John, chapter 15.
