Dress Code 2020-2021

St. Paul's Lutheran School is a place for instruction and learning. We dress for the occasion, in this case, school. The dress code is designed to help our students make a statement to others about the Christian character of our school and reduce the distractions that get in the way of learning.

All clothing must be neat, clean and in good repair, and must not detract from the **Christian atmosphere of the school.**

It is your responsibility as parents to assist your children at home before coming to school so they will be dressed appropriately. Parents play a key role in enforcing the dress code, and we appreciate the support.

Any new styles, fads, apparel, or accessories that may be considered offensive or immodest for school dress will be considered inappropriate. Concerns that arise during the school year will be addressed by the faculty.

Classroom teachers and the principal will work for fairness and consistency and will have the final authority in all dress code concerns or infractions. Before wearing any clothing that may be questionable, please consult with your classroom teacher.

Failure to adhere to these guidelines will result in action taken to correct the behavior including:

- parents bringing alternate clothing to school
- clothing provided to the student to wear for the remainder of the school day

Continued violations of the dress code may result in the parent being required to meet with the teacher and/or principal.

CHAPEL

Chapel days are special days to worship as a school body. All students are asked to wear dress clothes on chapel days (WEDNESDAY).

CHAPEL FAMILY SHIRTS

On pre-announced days, students will be asked to wear their chapel family shirt to school. These days include some Wednesdays and Fridays when we meet with our chapel family groups. Students are welcome to wear the shirt any other day as well.

SCHOOL SPIRIT DAYS

Fridays are St. Paul's spirit wear days. Students are encouraged to wear your favorite Panther spirit wear or our school colors (red, white, and black). All dress code guidelines still apply on these days.

SPIRIT WEEKS

We have two spirit weeks during the school year, one in November and the other in February. Look forward to special dress-up days during these exciting weeks.

ST. PAUL'S STUDENTS WILL BE EXPECTED TO ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING STANDARDS WHILE AT SCHOOL:

PANTS

Pants must be properly fitting, and they may not be intentionally frayed or have holes in them. -Capri-length pants may be worn. Close-fitting, knit pants (i.e. leggings, stretch pants) may be worn with a dress, skirt, or a top that covers the pockets or extends to the fingertips. Sleepwear, flannel, and pajama pants may not be worn.

SHORTS

Shorts may be worn from May 1st until the end of October 31st. Shorts' length may be no shorter than mid-thigh. Spandex/bike shorts are not allowed unless worn under a dress or skirt. Sleepwear and pajama shorts may not be worn.

SKIRTS/DRESSES

Skirts and dresses may be no shorter than mid-thigh. Skorts are acceptable throughout the year, but must meet the length requirement for skirts.

SHIRTS

Shirts with manufacturer logos, team names, and novelty t-shirts are acceptable. Students may not wear shirts deemed to be offensive by the faculty. Shirts may not be cut low in the front, back, or sides. Hooded sweatshirts are acceptable. Sleeveless tops must be no narrower all the way around than the entire width of the hand. Current SPWA athletic uniforms (including warm-up shirts) may not be worn. Other team jerseys may be worn with an acceptable t-shirt underneath.

HAIR

Hair should be carefully groomed, combed, and kept neat and clean. Hair should not fall over the eyes. Extreme hairstyles and coloring are not allowed. Improper coloring of the hair, including, for example, use of hair chalk, must be dyed back to its normal hair color immediately. Hats are not to be worn in the building except on special days.

SHOES

Shoes must be worn at all times during school. No slide or flip-flop style shoes may be worn. Students must have a separate gym shoe to be used on the gym floor. The shoes should have non-marking soles that prevent black marks on the gym floor. Shoes worn by students at the ECC must have backs on them.

MISCELLANEOUS

No temporary tattoos or drawing with ink on the body is allowed.

Clothing must have appropriate coverage during all activities including: standing, sitting, leaning over, and raising your hand.
