"If you continue in my Word, you are truly my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8:31-32)

It was one of the first times I taught an adult instruction class in the teachings of the Christian faith. I had asked the people in the class to share why they had signed up to attend the class. Then one of the students asked, "Why are you here teaching this class?" I responded something like this: "I believe that the love and grace of Christ Jesus and the

truth of his Word that I am going to teach you in the next few weeks are absolutely the most important things in life."

I still believe that. That's why I left the profession of being a Certified Public Accountant to become a pastor over thirty years ago. I want people to know about Jesus, to trust His promises and to follow the teachings of His Holy Word. There is absolutely nothing more important in life.

How well do you know the Bible? How well do you know the heart of Jesus? The answer for most people who answer in truth is this: "I don't know Jesus and His Word as well as I should." So I want to encourage you to considering making a big commitment to grow in knowing Jesus and His truth. We are having a twelve-week adult instruction class beginning on Saturday, January 21. It will meet at 9:00am and goes to about 10:15 or 10:30am each Saturday. It is a great way to grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18)

So hear the words and the heart of Jesus in the gospel of John: "If you continue in my Word, you are truly my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8:31-32) There is great freedom, hope, and peace found in knowing and following Jesus. I hope you will consider coming to the class.
