I have a dream

So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built on the foundation of the apostles and the prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone. Ephesians 2:19-20

This last Monday we celebrated Martin Luther King jr. Day. Though this is not the Martin Luther that we are named after as Lutherans, it is good to reflect and remember the wonderful things that God had done with this man. He lived in a time when the country was divided, and many citizens were not afforded the same rights as others due to their race. Still being relatively young as a nation, America had to ask itself these questions; what did it mean to be a citizen, and what qualifies you to have all the rights and privileges of one? What does it mean to be the United States of America, and what will it take to be united? Indeed we are still asking these questions as we enter another election year, and the country seems to be divided as ever.

I am no historian, and cannot claim to have the answers for America as a country. But what is fascinating is that the Early Church had to ask themselves several of these same questions. What did it mean to be a Citizen, what qualifications were necessary? Also what does it mean to be a united Church, and what indeed would unite them?

Paul puts it so clearly throughout all of his letters, but especially here in his letter to the Ephesians. Jesus is the answer to all of these questions. What did it mean to be a citizen, or member, of the church? Being connected to Jesus. What unifies the Church is Jesus. It is Jesus who brings us together, and it is Jesus that holds us together.

What is amazing is how well Jesus holds us together, even when we get divided. Church's divide due to disagreements of doctrine, but Jesus still has his people in other denominations. Even within denominations there are things that divide, but we are held together. Distance, time and even death itself try to divide the people of God but Jesus holds us together through his death and resurrection. As Paul says elsewhere in Ephesians, there is One Lord, one Faith and One Baptism.

America will always be divided, it does not have a sure foundation. But as Church we have a sure foundation, and we will always be united no matter how hard the world tries to divide us. So when you are feeling dismayed about the divisions of this country, look to Christ and remember that in him we are united by something far greater than ideals or principles. We are united by his death and resurrection, and all who believe in him will live together forever with him. United in Heaven.

REGISTRATION NEWS FOR THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR

Starting February 1st, we will begin to register students for the 2024-2025 school year. **All registrations will be completed on-line using FACTS.**

- Non-Choice families will need to pay a \$125 registration fee per child, if it is **before March 15**th. After March 15th, the registration fee goes to \$175 per child.
- All Choice enrollment opens February 1. Choice families will need to go on the DPI website and re-enroll and register on-line in FACTS. Please note that the WISCONSIN CHOICE PROGRAM application period ends April 18. Call the school office if you have any questions.
- Any family that refers a NEW, enrolling family to St. Paul's, will receive a \$150 gift card. Get out there and start spreading the word about what a great school we have here!
- If you have a **St. Paul's yard sign** sitting in your garage, get it out and proudly display it on the snow bank in your front yard!

FYI-The Department of Public Instruction shows that participation in Wisconsin's parental school choice programs continues to grow. Nearly 55,000 students are enrolled in one of Wisconsin's four parental choice programs — an increase of 2,760 from last year — attending one of 383 schools. Both marks represent record participation. This comes on the heels of Governor Tony Evers and Republican legislative leaders agreeing to an historic bipartisan funding increase as part of state budget negotiations earlier this year. **"School choice is growing because it works.**
