That Was NO Accident!

They put him to death by nailing him to a cross. But this was God's plan which he had made long ago.

Acts 2:23

The cross was no accident.

Jesus' death was part of a plan. The cross wasn't some kind of tragic surprise. Calvary was not a knee-jerk response to a world plummeting toward destruction. It wasn't a patch-job or a stop-gap measure. The death of the Son of God was anything but unexpected.

No, it was part of an incredible plan. A calculated choice.

The moment the forbidden fruit touched the lips of Eve, the shadow of the cross appeared in the garden. And between that moment and the moment the soldier's hammer drove a spike through the wrist of God, a master plan was fulfilled.

From the Pastor

“You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come.” (Matthew 24:6, NIV)

War. It’s an unhappy thing to endure, even from a distance. It’s horrendous when, unprovoked, you find your nation under attack by an enemy. There is the “day that will live in infamy” of December 7, 1941. Unprovoked and even seeking to stay out of WW II, the Japanese Imperial Fleet attacked Pearl Harbor. For those who lived on the Islands of Hawaii and all those stateside, it was a sobering time. We were drawn into WW II and, by the grace of God, the armed forces of many nations put down the aggressors, including one Adolph Hitler.

It is just over sixty years later and we have another unprovoked attack. Russia, under President Putin’s leadership, has attacked the sovereign nation of Ukraine. Again, a free people are living in fear and facing the atrocities of war. So we pray for them. We are with them in our hearts. Many nations have spoken out against this action and are taking different measures to respond. One way we can respond is with a donation. If you text LCMSUKRAINE to 41444 you will get a link to make a secure, online donation that will be used to help the people who are becoming refugees as well as those holding their ground in their own nation. You can also go on to lcms.org and click on “Caring for Ukraine” and find other ways to give and support.

Jesus told us there would be “wars and rumors of war.” Jesus said that these kinds of things “must happen.” We don’t always know why, but we do know what it points to: “The end is yet to come.” The world will one day come to an end. Christ will return to judge the living and the dead. In this truth we hope . . . even in difficult days. So keep on praying and keep the faith.

Also, don’t forget that we are going to watch *The Lion King* from a Christian perspective this coming Sunday, March 13 @ 3:30pm in the gymnasium. There will be free popcorn and drinks. There will be a “hot dog and chips” dinner provided as well. We hope that you and your kids of all ages will be there!! May God bless us all, everyone!
