## **FROM THE PASTOR**

"If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is speaking to you ... you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." John 4:10

She had lived a pretty rough life. Some of the difficulties were of her own making, while others were the direct result from loveless acts of others. She had been married and divorced five times. She was that talk of the town, the kind of talk that tears down and pours salt into wounds. She was despised and disregarded and ignored. She tried to avoid everyone.

So when the time came to draw water from a well, she didn't go early in the morning like the rest did. She would go to draw water in the heat of the day, to try to escape the looks of disdain and the embarrassment she carried with her daily. At times, she must have wondered, "How in the world did I end up in this life situation?"

Then one day she went to draw water in the heat of the day . . . and there was a man at the well. He was a Jew, she was a Samaritan. She probably figured that she didn't need to worry about talking to him because Jews ignore Samaritans. But when she approached the well, the man asked her for a drink. Surprised, maybe even shocked, she asked, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask for a drink from me, a woman of Samaria?"

That's when the man spoke the quote at the top of this article. It was Jesus who said, *"If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is speaking to you ... you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." John 4:10* A bit later, Jesus asked her to go get her husband. Not currently married, she told him I don't have a husband. Then Jesus prophetically told her the story of her life: "You are right in saying, 'I have no husband;' for you have had five husbands and the one you now have is not your husband."

The most important thing to realize is that Jesus offered *this woman* living water! Jesus offered her the refreshing waters of God's grace, mercy, and forgiveness. Jesus offered her a brand new start in life, setting her free from the past stained with sin and heartache. Later on, coming to believe that Jesus was the long-awaited Messiah and set free by the love of Christ, *this woman* started telling everyone in the village about Jesus. What an amazing turnaround in her life . . . all because of God's Grace and Love in Jesus!

We meet many people in our lives, our paths crossing here a there, in our neighborhoods, at the store, at the State Fair or at a restaurant. Those who know Jesus, they should be just like that woman, ready to share with others the One who offers living waters to refresh the souls of all, no matter where they have been sleeping. We all need the living waters that only Jesus can provide.
