LINCOLN CAR LINE

The efficiency of our carline has come a long way the past couple of years, but I think there is still room for improvement. Please remember these things:

1. **Right Turn Only**-Trying to turn left on Lincoln is a challenging maneuver. While it is legal, it is dangerous and really backs up the flow of cars. If you need to go West, try turning right on Lincoln, then right on 78th Street, then right on either Hayes or Arthur Avenues.
2. **Crossing Lincoln to ECC**- as an alternative to trying to cross Lincoln Avenue (another hair-raising maneuver), try **turning right on Lincoln** and then left on 78th to Grant Street.
3. **Pull Up to the front sign or cone.** Enough said on that.
4. **Make it quick!** – Make sure your child is ready to exit quickly.
