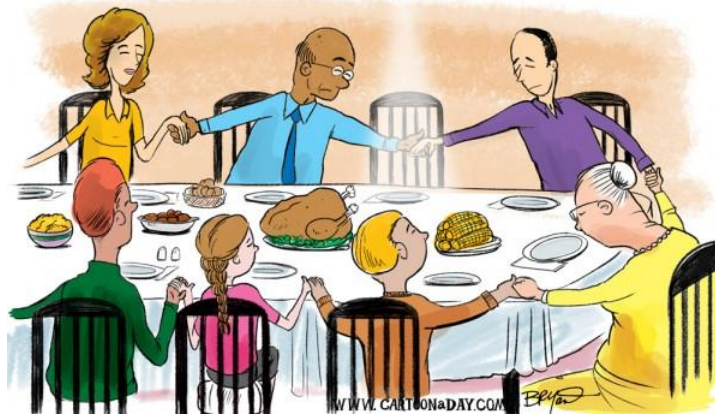

Dear families of St. Paul's Lutheran School,
