FROM THE PRINCIPAL

In **Luke 17**, we read the story of the ten lepers. These ten guys had the dreaded, disfiguring disease that made a person unclean, unfit for society, and virtually subhuman. The tremendous physical toll inflicted by this incurable disease was only surpassed by the great emotional toll of feeling worthless, vile, and unlovable.

Can you imagine the overwhelming exhilaration these guys must have felt when they were healed? Their leprosy was cleansed! The disease that had taken virtually everything from them was now gone! They could return to their families! They could return to society! They could really live again! Nine of them scurried away to enjoy their great blessing.

But one guy turned back ...

This guy was also overcome with exhilaration at his cleansing, but he wanted to give thanks and praise to the One who made it possible. He couldn't dream of taking another step without glorifying God and expressing his sincere gratitude. The question for us is clear: why do so many experience the goodness of God and so few return with grateful thanksgiving?

This Thanksgiving, let me challenge you as I challenge myself to emulate the Samaritan in this story and stop to give thanks, first and foremost. To be sure, giving thanks can be difficult at times. Life can be cruel and hard. Circumstances can knock us down and leave us devastated. If we are not careful, we can easily become disillusioned, depressed, critical, cynical, and bitter.

The key to rising above the circumstances: focus on what you do have, not what you don't have. Rejoice in the Lord! Give thanks for the cross and the empty tomb! Give thanks for His unfailing love! I truly believe the greatest witnesses for Christ are those who have experienced the worst of life and yet have the best of attitudes, continuing to praise God no matter what.

Make this Thanksgiving a Thanksgiving to remember as you set aside time to glorify the King. He will be honored, and you will be blessed.

From the Pastor

On October 3, 1789, George Washington, the first president of these United States of America, issued a proclamation calling for all the people of our nation to unite in rendering "sincere and humble thanks" to the Lord God, the Almighty. This was to take place on Thursday, November 26, 1789. It was seventy four years later under the leadership of President Abraham Lincoln that it became a national holiday to be celebrated on the fourth Thursday of November.

Washington's original proclamation began with these words: "Whereas it is the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey his will, to be grateful for his benefits, and humbly to implore his protection and favor—and whereas both Houses of Congress have by their joint Committee requested me "to recommend to the People of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness."

It's hard to believe in this year of our Lord, 2022, that our nation was once that strong in faith . . . that *political leaders* called the people of these United States of America to "render unto God sincere and humble thanks." Well, you probably won't hear that call from our elected leaders this year, but you will hear it from the pastoral leadership of St. Paul's Lutheran Church and School.

We have so much to be grateful for in our lives. "Every good and perfect gift comes from above, coming down from the Father of lights" (James 1:17). If our earthly blessings weren't enough, God loved us enough to give us Jesus to be our Savior. Count your blessings this Thanksgiving. Pray and give thanks to God!
