May God continue to keep you in your Baptismal Grace! October 31, 1517 is an important date in history, not only for Lutherans, but for the entire Holy Christian Church on earth. What happened that day? Was there a big Halloween party? NO! It was the day in history that Martin Luther posted 95 theses regarding some false teaching in the church. He posted it on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Why October 31? It was the day before "All Saints Day," (November 1) and Luther new that the church would be packed.

So on the last weekend of this month, October 28-29, we will have a Reformation service, remembering these historic events. It's called the "Reformation" because Luther sought spiritual "reforms" in the church in Germany. Luther's main concern was that the Gospel of our Lord Jesus, the good news of His salvation given as a free gift . . . this wonderful truth had become buried under church traditions, some of which we totally contrary to Holy Scripture.

On this weekend, we will also be having several of our students from St. Paul's assist with the worship services. They will be ushering, reading the lessons, singing a song, and helping in other ways. I want to invite you and your family to be in attendance. It will be a wonderful time of worship and praise and growing in faith in our Lord.

On Sunday, October 29, after the 10:30 service, we will also be having a "Reformation Festival" on our playground. It will be a "potluck" with those attending providing most of the food. It will be a fun day of fellowship, games, and gathering with family and friends. I hope you will consider attending and bring some food to share!

Three of the grand truths that were brought again to the fore during the Reformation are called the "three solas." "Sola" in Latin means "alone." The truth of the gospel is that we are saved by God's grace *alone*, through faith in Christ *alone*, as is taught in the Scirptures *alone*. Sola gratia, sola fide, sola scriptura: Grace alone, faith alone, Scripture alone! What a joy to know the good news of Jesus. Let us rejoice that this truth now abounds throughout many of the denominations in Christ's one holy, Christian, and apostolic Church.

In Christ **alone,** Pastor Bender
