FROM THE PRINCIPAL





I love everything about the fall season. I love the smell and feel of it when the air turns cool and crisp. I love the sound of it when I walk through leaves and everything crunches. I love the taste of it in warm apple pies and pumpkin spiced coffee. And I love the colors of fall... the corn fields all turned golden, the brilliant yellows, reds, and orange of leaves splashed against the backdrop of a grey blue sky...

However, as I sat admiring the work of His hand one day... I thought, it's ironic that we admire the beauty of leaves most as they are dying. Death is rarely (if ever) something that we think of as beautiful. Yet as I looked at the magnificence of the dying leaves outside my window, I couldn't help but think of the parallel to our life in Christ. The amazing reality for believers is... that because of Christ's own glorious death (and resurrection), death for us has been made a beautiful thing.

Like leaves in the Fall, we are made beautiful through our death in Christ. As His redeemed we have no fear of death and can long for the day when we will see our Savior face to face. And for that reason, as it says in Philippians 1:21, for us... to die is only gain!

Beyond our physical death, however, there is a death we are called to in this life. A death to self. Like the leaves in Fall, our lives grow ever more brilliant as we embrace the crucified life, dying to ourselves and reflecting the glory of the cross and Christ's resurrection. Leaves in the Fall must die, but in their death, they are beautiful! Similarly, there is beauty in the crucified life of Jesus our Savior.

Reformation Weekend

This weekend is truly an exciting one. The kids are all getting dressed up in their costumes ready to receive the sugar high that is Halloween. It is wonderful to watch the community get together and look out for one another every Halloween! However, this is not the only thing that we are celebrating this weekend, there is another important Holiday. The holiday I am speaking of is Reformation Day. This is the day that we celebrate what God did through a man named Martin Luther.

Martin was a Catholic Monk in the 1500's. At that time the church was focused on raising money and teaching people falsely about the forgiveness of sins. According to what the church was teaching at the time God's primary role was judge, and he hated all sinners. The preaching had an emphasis on hell, and what would happen to you if you did not earn God's forgiveness. Talk about terrifying preaching! Martin Luther knew that he was a sinner, and that he deserved to go to hell. However the avenues of salvation did not seem satisfactory to him. He could do acts of penance, works to make up for your past sins. He would beat himself as a punishment for his failures. He could also buy indulgences, pieces of paper that the church was saying were your ticket to heaven. None of these seemed to be enough for Martin Luther, and so he went into the scriptures to seek the truth. This was truly remarkable for at the time the Bible was only written in Latin, and most common people did not know Latin. As he studied the scriptures he realized the church was wrong; we could not earn forgiveness of sins through our

works or our money. Instead Jesus has already paid the full price so that forgiveness could be ours, and he gives this grace to his people through the Word, Baptism and Holy Communion. God is not a God who desires to send his people to hell, but gives them salvation here in this world!

Well when Martin Luther discovered the truth he was set free! He was free from guilt, free from fear. He needed the whole world to know it, he needed them to know this freedom and grace that he discovered. So he went to the front doors of the Church and posted all the lies the church was teaching, and the truth of the Gospel. (This to us would have been similar to posting this on facebook). Word quickly spread, the people heard the Gospel, and the Church found out and tried to silence him, but they could not. The teachings of Jesus were back in the world, and the world had been set free!

This is what we celebrate on Reformation Day- that the truth of the Gospel was rediscovered. That we can know the love of Christ, and the fullness of his grace. So this weekend come and celebrate with us. Celebrate the truth of God's Word which sets sinners free. I do not know what is chaining you or weighing you down, but come and be free with us this weekend. Let Christ remove your chains and heavy burdens and give you the free gift of the Gospel all over again.
