FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Hebrews 12:1 *Let us run the race that is before us and never give up.*

I found out this week that the word **race** is from the Greek word **agon**, from which we get the word **agony**. The Christian's race is not a nice leisurely jog through Kettle Moraine on a beautiful Fall day, but rather a demanding and grueling, sometimes agonizing race. It takes a massive effort to finish our Earthly race strong.

Likely you have noticed that many don't do that? Surely you have observed that there are many on the side of the trail? They used to be running. There was a time when they could keep the pace. But then weariness set in, tough terrain took its toll. They didn't think the run would be this tough, and they gave up....

By contrast, Jesus' best work was His final work, and His strongest step was His last step. Our Master is the classic example of one who endured....He could have easily quit the race like so many others. But He didn't. Let's follow His lead. It takes a massive effort to finish strong in a spiritual race. What steps can you take to build your spiritual stamina?

Students and parents have been doing a great job of getting sponsors and raising money! Students can continue raising money and adding to their totals all the way through next week. SECURITY UPDATES

The safety of all students, staff, and visitors is something we take very seriously. We are constantly evaluating our building security and updating policies and procedures. As a result of that we are implementing the following changes:

- **Visitor Registration**-anyone that visits our campuses **MUST** come to the Office first and sign in. They will then be issued a bright yellow Visitor badge to be worn at all times while in the building. This holds true for every visit, from dropping off a lunch in someone's locker to visiting a classroom. Students will be taught to look for the bright yellow Visitor stickers and to report anyone not registered to their teacher.
- **Classroom and Office doors** will now be closed and locked during the day.
- Please know that there have been no incidents or problems here at SPWA. We are always analyzing our Emergency Response Plans with the WAPD, making updates where needed, and then using those plans to teach our children the appropriate responses.
- The money PTL raises from the **Color-Run** this year will all go towards more security upgrades. Our goal is to raise \$10,000.

SECURITY COSTS

Listed below are some of our wish-list security items. Perhaps your place of work offers grants or has a matching gifts program that would allow you or your employer to purchase, or help purchase some of the items.

- Electronic locks on Office door (\$3000)
- Portable radios for all staff (\$3000 (15 X200))
- Shatterproof film on Office windows (\$700)
- Shatterproof film on ECC windows (\$8000)

CHOICE MEETINGS

As most of you know, St. Paul's participates in the Wisconsin Parent Choice Program and the Milwaukee Parent Choice Program. One of the stipulations of the Choice Program is to hold two meetings per school year to meet with all families to answer any questions about the Choice Program, get any information about the Choice Program, and learn about the Choice Program. Our first meeting this school year is Thursday, October 17th at 6:00pm. School Board members will be available to answer any of your questions. FROM THE PASTOR

How is everything going with you?? When asked this question, we tend to say "I am just fine" or "Everything is good" or "I'm doing okay." Often, this is not exactly the truth and sometimes what we are going through in our lives is far from it. Now, I know that often we give a quick and rather positive response because we know the person asking is probably not ready for us to unload on them all our burdens and problems. However, where do we turn when life gets tough?

God's Word calls Christians to be "burden carriers." Listen to just a few Bible verses on this. *"Carry each other's burdens and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."* (Galatians 6:2) Jesus Himself says, *"Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."* (Matthew 11:28) And Peter writes in his first epistle, *"Live in harmony with one another, be sympathetic, love as brothers, be compassionate and humble."* (1 Peter 3: 8)

This is how each one of us ought to live. We should be there for one another. This is also one of the characteristics that we desire to show forth at St. Paul's Lutheran School. Please look for drop off dates to begin after January 2020. Thank you for your understanding and your continued support.

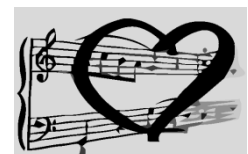
