FROM THE PASTOR

I know you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted. Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge? Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know. Job 42:2-3

Job certainly had an interesting lesson that was given to him- one that we learn constantly even though it is hard. The whole story of Job is about Job trying to figure God out. You see God was doing things that just didn't make sense. From Job's perspective he had lost everything; his health, his wealth, his home, his livestock, even his children. As he lay in misery his wife told him to give up, curse God and die! His friends came and said all of this must have happened because Job did something to anger God. Eventually Job had enough and demanded answers from God.

Who could blame Job for demanding answers from God after losing everything? We do the same when we have minor inconveniences, we all have said at least at one point, "God how could you let this happen?" God is a good and gracious God, and yet he allows bad things to happen- even to his people. And so often we demand answers from him.

When God came down and spoke to Job he did not give any answers. You would think God would take Job and explain everything to him, but God did something completely different. He asked Job if he was God. He then asked Job where he was when everything was made, and if it was Job who sustained all life. Of course Job being a man was not around when all things were made, and he was not the one who sustains all things. Only God is. Once God reminded Job of this, Job responded with the words that I shared above from Job 42.

So often we wonder why God does what he does, and so often he doesn't give an explanation. The truth is, he doesn't need to give an explanation. As a professor of mine often repeated "God is God and we are not." Who can fathom the power of God, who can delve into his wisdom? It is too much for us, no one can comprehend it. God can do whatever he wants on a whim, and we would be powerless to understand it much less stop him. It is truly a terrifying thing to realize how dependant we are on one we cannot understand and cannot control. It is humbling to realize and ask the question "Who am I to question him or his ways."

However our God is not just a hidden God that is unknowable. He is also the revealed God. He has revealed himself to us in the person of Jesus Christ. In Christ we do not only see his power and might, but his infinite love and his abounding grace. So in the face of this almighty hidden God we cling to the cross, and trust in the Word of God which has been revealed. For this Word gives us promises- that though we may not understand what he is doing he is indeed with us and not against us. His acts are for the good of those who love him. So instead of becoming frustrated delving into the hidden God, when his ways are insearchable and our questions unanswerable, go to the cross and be filled with knowledge of who he is. He is the one who sent his Son to die for us. He could have sent another flood, he could have caused this world to perish in an instant. Instead he chose the cross out of love. Why did he do this? Who can know, but the fact that he has is enough for us. Therefore the cross is indeed enough of an answer when we begin to wonder what he is doing.
